

Culture Night in Copenhagen – experience the charming capital city *by night*

Friday 11 October you can experience Copenhagen, Denmark's beautiful capital city, in a completely different and special way, when the yearly Culture Night transforms Copenhagen into a lively world of infinite and unique experiences. Culture Night in Copenhagen is the city's – and the country's – biggest one-day event which with one ticket gives you and your family access to more than 230 cultural events only available this one time a year.

When darkness descends on Copenhagen 11 October, it kicks off a magical evening where you are invited to go adventuring in the city's various neighbourhoods and search for hidden treasures hiding behind the beautiful, illuminated facades. More than 230 organizers, including museums, theatres, churches, castles and ministries, open their doors to the public on Culture Night in Copenhagen inviting them inside to experience unique events which in an entertaining way take children and adults on an educational trip and to wonderful locations not normally open to the public after dark.

Royal Life

If you enjoy a little bit of royalty, Culture Night offers you an opportunity to taste Copenhagen's royal life and history at some of the beautiful palaces in the city. For instance, the evening offers an example of the crowning of an absolute monarch at [Rosenborg Castle](#), at [The Royal Stables](#) you can see the king's white horses, or how about visiting [The Amalienborg Museum](#), the palace where Christian X lived, or [Frederiksberg Palace](#) and hear about the history of the palaces. You can also experience MADE OF STARDUST at [Christiansborg Palace – The Chapel](#) – a digital work of art only to be experienced this one night.

Art and Architecture

Many museums and art halls such as [SMK – The National Gallery](#) and [Nikolaj Kunsthal](#) are open to Culture Night guests. You are invited to go behind the scenes and experience new works of art and be creative yourself. Why not also visit Copenhagen's oldest and most charming arts and crafts street [Rørholmegade](#) with 13 galleries or get an insight into classic as well new architecture in Copenhagen. Have a look at the wonderful [University Library](#) from 1861 and hear about its history, experience the [Odd Fellow Palace](#) from 1756 or [Danske Banks](#) new headquarters which so beautifully integrate art and historical artifacts.

Culinary Copenhagen

Copenhagen is famous for its culinary delights, and Culture Night also offers you opportunities to try out various aspects of the Nordic cuisine. In the attractive and hip area called [Banegaarden](#) you can hear about fermentation and wild herbs and join a community dinner, [Copenhagen Hospitality College](#) offers you street food, beer tasting and cake mania, at [Moltke's Palace](#) you can taste samples from the palace's own kitchen, and you can taste the famous Town Hall pancakes at [Copenhagen City Hall](#).

Mostly for Kids

Do not be afraid to bring your family with you on Culture Night, because you can be absolutely sure that no one will get bored. Who, for instance, would not like a trip in [Zoo](#) by night, or explore the underground like a real archaeologist at the [Archaeological Workshop](#)? There are plenty of adventures inside the ramparts of [The Citadel](#), where you, e.g., can visit a WW2 bunker, and if you dare, you can also take a trip in [prison](#). Experience [The Danish Parliament](#) from the inside, when it is open to everyone on Culture Night.

The more than 230 special events on Culture Night are open on 11 October from 18:00-00:00 (a few places only till 23:00). Some events require registration in advance.

All you need to take part in Culture Night is a [Culture Night Pass](#). A Culture Night Pass costs DKK 125. Two children under 12 are free of charge when accompanied by an adult with a Culture Night Pass.

A Culture Night Pass provides access to all the events of Culture Night and to free transport by bus, train and Metro in Greater Copenhagen (zones 1-99) from 16:00 to 04:00. You can also take the Culture Night boats and veteran busses until midnight.

As of 1 September, you can buy your Culture Night Pass on Culture Night's website and download it, so that you have it on your phone. If you prefer a physical pass, you can buy tickets as of 30 September in all 7-Eleven shops in Greater Copenhagen.

With the wide range of events available, it might be a good idea to plan your Culture Night. The Culture Night website offers excellent planning opportunities. You can sort thematically or geographically for events and create a profile under '[My Culture Night](#)', where you can save the events, you are interested in.

About Culture Night

Culture Night saw the light of day in 1993 and has been Denmark's biggest one-day event for more than 30 years. The Culture Night Association plans and carries out Culture Night, and the object of the association has right from the start been to create the city's biggest cultural event in which everyone can take part. Members do not pay dues, and everyone works for free except the Culture Night secretariat. Culture Night receives no subsidies from the state nor the municipalities, and the only sponsor is DOT (Your Public Transport) which sponsors transportation on the actual Culture Night. All income stems from the sale of Culture Night Passes, and any profits are exclusively used to fund cultural events at next year's Culture Night in Copenhagen. This year Culture Night has provided DKK 3.8 mill in support of events on Culture Night.
