

Family Culture Night programme 2025 is ready – see all the events [here](#)

On Friday 14 March it is Family Culture Night in Copenhagen once again, offering a mass of cultural events – all of them focused on children and their adults. Ahead of you lies unforgettable experiences when museums, churches and castles invite you in for an evening full of magic for children at all ages. The entire programme is now ready and easy to access, so click in and put together your perfect route through the city and Family Culture Night's many fun and educative special events.

There is lots to look forward to. The light is returning, spring is on its way and the children's own Culture Night is just round the corner. On 14 March, Copenhagen opens its doors to a world of culture specifically for children, inviting them to take active part and appealing to their senses through play, immersion and creativity. All children are welcome and this year the tiny ones from 0-2 years can also take part through the concept 'Art on Maternity Leave' which offers a perfect framework for them and their parents at the Nikolaj Kunsthal.



“ It's our ambition through Family Culture Night to spread cultural experiences out to as many children as possible and to awaken their curiosity and interest in everything the city can offer. And this year one can look forward to an event especially aimed at tiny ones with their parents where prams, baby bottles and room for tumbling around are integrated in the cultural experience. Also this year, we've elected to specify the age categories for the various events to make it easier for the adults to find the right experiences for their children, “says Marie Myschetzky, Head of Secretariat of the Culture Night Association.

Family Culture Night grows each year, and you can therefore look forward to even more experiences when the many participating locations open their doors at 4pm on 14 March to adventures within art, theatre, music and creativity. All you need to take part is a Culture Night Pass, and you are ready to explore the special events which you can only experience this once a year.

For instance, this year you can start your Family Culture Night by trying to steer a train at [TrainGamia](#) or [DSB](#) in full uniform, or you can get close to the universe and the stars in [The Round Tower](#). When darkness falls, you might like to visit [Rosenborg Castle](#), if you dare! Because all the lights have been switched off, so you need a torch to explore the rooms. [The Amalienborg Museum](#) invites you to a masked ball and you can make your own mask for the ball before the dancing starts. At [Thorvaldsen's Museum](#) you can be transformed into a piece of art in the beautifully lighted halls, and at [Frederiksbergs Forsyning \(Utility Company\)](#) the magical world of rushing water is translated into beautiful music. You can use your body when [BLOX](#) invites all children to test their mettle on acrobatics and circus arts, and if you want more acrobatic challenges you can take part in building a human tower at [Xiquets Copenhagen](#)! For small kids there are fun plays at the [Riddersalen Theatre](#), [Frederiksberg Library](#) and the [Monster Theatre](#), while the tiny ones and their parents are invited to go on a tour and tumble around with Art on Maternity Leave at the [Nikolaj Kunsthal](#). If you find you need an alternative perspective, [GoBoat](#) invites you to Family Culture Night on the water, while [Copenhill](#) offers a treasure hunt high above the city and here - and at many other participating venues - you can quench your hunger and thirst.

About Family Culture Night

Family Culture Night is Culture Night as you know it – but exclusively aimed at children. It takes place on 14 March from 4-8pm with events for children from 2-5 years old, 5-8 years old and 8-12 years old. The full programme is available [here](#).

You can buy a Culture Night Pass for Family Culture Night online in [Kulturnattens webshop](#). It costs DKK 125, if you are 12 and older. With a Family Culture Pass you can bring two children under 12 years old to all events free of charge.

A Culture Night Pass is also your ticket to free transportation by bus, train and Metro in Greater Copenhagen in zones 1-99 from 3pm to 9pm on 14 March, and here too an adult can bring two children under 12 years old with him/her free of charge.

About the Culture Night Association

The Culture Night Association in Copenhagen has since 1993 planned and executed the Copenhagen Culture Night and since 2019 also been behind the Family Culture Night. Members do not pay a membership fee and everyone works for free except the secretariat of the Association. The Culture Night Association receives no subsidies from the Government nor from the municipalities. The only sponsor is DOT who sponsors transportation every year. All income stems from the sale of Culture Night Passes, and any profit is exclusively used for carrying out cultural events at next year's Culture Night in Copenhagen and Frederiksberg. In 2024 Culture Night awarded DKK 3.8 million in support of events on Culture Night.
